Community Forum: Julie Smith who lives on Laurelwood in the Marshall Town area addressed the council with concerns of roaming dogs. The Mayor stated that roaming dogs have been a problem for years, and we have been looking for a solution. I have recently visited the animal shelter in Linden, and it seems to be working well. When the Linden shelter picks up an animal, the owner is required to pay a fee to have the animal released. Each time the animal is picked-up the fee increases. A large live trap has recently been utilized by the Parsons PD, but is just too slow a process to be effective, according to Director of Safety Dale King. We will continue to look into the different options to see what we need to do.

His report noted that the city is collecting the monies that they are supposed to and addressing delinquent situations in a prompt manner. He added that good business practices and polices are in place. Mr. Poole relayed to the board that both the water/sewer and natural gas were operating at a surplus. "If I was on this board that would be great news." He added. No areas of concern were noted in his report and he continued the city has always been able to meet its debt payments on schedule.
