Mayor Boaz presented a slide show of the new Tennessee Street Park in Savannah, Tennessee. The presentation featured a new water park with walking trails, playgrounds, and picnic areas. Hardin County Mayor Kevin Davis said that the county donated the property, and worked with the city to apply for an LPRF Grant. The City of Savannah funded the rest of the project. Savannah receives an appropriate share of the state tourism money allocated to the county whereas Parsons does not receive any funds from the tourism act. Decatur County does not choose to share any of these funds with the municipalities.
