Regular Board Meeting July 6, 2015

The Parsons City Council met for its regular monthly meeting, Monday, July 6, 2015, at 6:00 p.m. at the city council meeting room. Mayor Tim David Boaz called the meeting to order.

Community Forum-

The City of Parsons received a notice that every four years the City Board needs to decide where to do a resolution to exempt the city from applicability of statewide building construction safety standards in one-family and two family dwellings within the City's jurisdiction.

Tim Planer, a residential building inspection supervisor with the State of Tennessee, told the council members that the city had three options:

- 1. Opt out with no building codes
- 2. Exempt with city's own building inspector
- 3. Partner with the state for residential building coded through the state fire marshall's office. The state would then require three inspections, foundation, framing, and final.

If the city wishes to be exempt, then the council members must adopt a resolution.

Several questions where asked:

- Where would the permits be purchased, and at what cost?
 Permits would be purchased from the city.
 Cost is on a scale according to the cost of the house, such as a \$125,000 house permit would be \$450.00 (Construction cost should not go up because a building contractor is bidding to them cost)
- 2. What restrictions with contractors have, and what would they think about it? Local contractors would have a license or homeowners can purchase a permit themselves and they could hire whoever they wanted. The owners then take on the liability.
- 3. Is it more restrictive or is it like an electrical inspection? It's a state code, have to confirm to the 2009 Southern Building guidelines, some have gone to the 2012, but it is similar to an electrical inspection Most good contractors have no trouble with building codes.

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Mayor Tim David Boaz stated "We just need to get this throughly aired out and put off until next month before we vote on it". "Talk to contractors and people around and come back for a vote."
