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### REPORTS FROM COMMITTEES, COUNCILMEN, AND OTHER OFFICERS

#### A) COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE MAYOR:

- a. Mayor Boaz brought up an idea to the council the possibility to lease out the Hanger for Performing Arts to the Chamber of Commerce to maximize usage since Toby, (Shane Bridges) has left town.
  - i. The city would have funds set aside to promote acts, plays, concerts, etc.
  - ii. Rivertime Players would still have a usage agreement with the Chamber to continue to have their shows throughout the year.
- b. No action taken at this time. The mayor wanted to open a dialogue with this topic.
- B) **PROJECT UPDATES:** Lee Villaflor gave an update on the current projects.
  - a. <u>Blighted Home Project:</u> Seven out of the eight houses on this project have been torn down, we only have one outstanding. We do not foresee this last house to be completed at this time.
  - b. ARP Sewer Project (Pipe Bursting): Construction is in progress. Bore is scheduled for tonight.
  - c. <u>ARP Water Plant Project (Drinking water)</u>: In construction. Control valves were installed last week. This project should be completed in the next couple of weeks.
  - d. <u>TAM (Tennessee Association of Museums Grant (Municipal Building Roof Replacement)</u>: This project is complete. All final grant paperwork has been submitted and approved.
  - e. <u>TDOT (Multimodal Grant)</u>: No new update. ROW plans under review at TDOT. TLM will follow up again in June. TDOT is behind on reviews.
  - f. <u>2024 CDBG (Passive Park)</u>: TLM coordinated Geotech studies. TLM is working to get rendering of Entrance gate. TLM anticipates approval on environmental documents in June.
  - g. <u>PHMSA Gas Grant</u>: Still early in the process. RFQ's have been sent to natural gas engineer firms.
  - h. <u>SRF 4<sup>th</sup> St Lift Station</u>: SRF review in process. Nothing needed, waiting for SRF approval.
  - i. <u>FEMA (2019 Hazardous Mitigation) Generator Grant</u>: Marsha Blackburn has a new representative in her office, maybe we will have a new update next month.
  - j. <u>USDA Truck grant</u>: No new updates.
